USF Study Abroad

The University of South Florida offers students the world as their classroom through its programs abroad. Whether a student chooses a short-term summer program, a semester or year spent at a university overseas, an internship or service learning experience, there is a program for each student need. Studying abroad provides a unique learning environment, which extends and enhances courses taken on the home campus. Students can study abroad at any time in their academic careers.

USF overseas programs are designed to appeal to a wide audience. Students in most disciplines can find a program of study that will complement their degree program. Courses provide USF credit and thus students can be assured that if they plan carefully, they will continue to make steady progress towards graduation while they are abroad. Students seeking to round out their resumes with experiences abroad, such as internships and service learning, will find options for them also.

Students from other universities and colleges are accepted into most USF programs, and community residents, teachers and other professionals needing to upgrade their skills or re-certify their expertise are welcome to apply to most programs. The USF reciprocal international exchange programs are open only to degree-seeking USF students who qualify.

Many programs include organized cultural excursions, visits to important sites, and opportunities to interact with local people. All include unparalleled opportunities for cultural immersion and in-depth insight into the host country.

USF study abroad programs range in length from one week (spring break or May intersession) to a full semester. A large number of faculty-led summer programs of 3-6 weeks provide the opportunity to concentrate study abroad in a summer session and help students fulfill the 9-hour summer enrollment requirement. All programs are developed as cost-effectively as possible. Federal and state financial aid can be applied to USF programs abroad, and the Study Abroad Office provides some scholarship assistance also. USF in Italy Program

Short-Term Spring and Summer Programs Abroad

(Listed alphabetically by country)

Short programs, generally USF faculty-led, offer students a brief introduction to living, studying and traveling in another country. These programs are organized so that students can earn academic credit while being immersed in the culture and society of the host country. Many students go on to enroll in longer programs of study overseas once they have participated in a USF-sponsored short spring or summer program abroad.

Argentina

Buenos Aires – 4 weeks, July

The cosmopolitan capital city of Buenos Aires is the site of a month-long program of Latin American literature, Argentine cultural history, theatre and advanced Spanish language study. A USF professor of Spanish who is from Buenos Aires accompanies students. The program provides guest house accommodations, excursions and cultural events and offers opportunities for interaction with local students. **6 USF credits.**

Canada

Quebec City

Summer, 4 or 8 weeks, July/August

The University of Laval offers two one-month programs of Intensive French Language during the summer, one mid-May to mid-June, the other early July to early August. Classes are given at all levels of French. Housing is arranged by the university, and a program of social activities and field trips is included.

China

Chinese Language & Culture

4 weeks, May/June

A 4-week intensive language learning program will be conducted by USF at the Shandong University of Science and Technology in Taian, China. Courses are offered at several levels, and free tutoring can be arranged with native speakers. Room and full board is provided. Cultural excursions include Beijing, Qufu (home of Confucius) An optional trip to Xian can be arranged. Program participants will also visit local schools and rural villages. **5-6 USF credits.**

China Service Learning Program

Beijing and rural China

4 weeks, July/August

USF is one of several US institutions that send American students to participate in the "Poverty Alleviation through Education Project" in China. This is a service-learning program that delivers educational resources to the poorest regions of China. A USF committee selects students who will receive scholarships through the Wang Foundation to volunteer in this program, paired together with Chinese students. The program provides an opportunity to learn about each other's cultures while working with e-learning community centers to mitigate rural poverty. **USF credit is available.**

China & Tibet Study Tour

3 weeks, June

A study tour that focuses on religion, society and culture in contemporary China and Tibet will begin in China's capital, Beijing, and travel to Tibet's capital Lhasa, then visit the southwestern city of Chengdu in Szechuan province via Hong Kong. Chinese religious and cultural heritage sites, as well as the most important Tibetan sacred sites will be visited. Meetings with students and teachers, on-site classes and discussions will reinforce participants' understanding of Chinese and Tibetan culture and history. **6 USF credits**, undergraduate or graduate.

Costa Rica

Monteverde

Globalization Field School in Community Health

5 weeks, June/July

Located in North Western Costa Rica, Monteverde occupies a unique ecological area called a "cloud forest". The USF program, co-sponsored by the Department of Anthropology and the College of Public Health, focuses on community health and wellness. The program is hosted by the Monteverde Institute, a non-profit educational and research association in Costa Rica. Field research, lectures and seminars, complemented by family stays, make this a program of cultural immersion. Several excursions are included in the program. Upper level undergraduate or graduate students of Anthropology, Public Health, Environmental Studies or allied fields will benefit most. **6 USF credits.**

San Jose

USF Costa Rica Spanish Language Program

4 weeks, June

This month-long group program is accompanied by a USF instructor of Spanish. Students who have had some prior Spanish language experience will benefit most, but any student wishing to study Spanish and earn USF credit may apply. Courses are offered at a language institute, Universal de idiomas, in the capital city of San Jose. Students live and take their meals with host families. Various group excursions, arranged by the institute, take students to scenic locations that Costa Rica is famous for. Students may remain at the language institute for an additional 2 or 4 weeks if they desire to continue their Spanish language study. **6 USF credits.**

USF College of Business Administration Program

USF and the University of Costa Rica

3 weeks, July/August

A program for students of business is organized in conjunction with the University of Costa Rica. Students enroll in two courses that provide an overview of Latin American business, one taught by a professor from the UCR and the other taught by the USF professor accompanying the program. The program is preceded by classes at USF. Classroom lectures are enhanced by field visits to businesses and government agencies as well as excursions to some of Costa Rica's most well-known sites. Hotel lodging, academic program, group activities and transportation in Costa Rica are included. **6 USF credits.**

Czech Republic

Prague

Programs in European Political and Cultural Studies

Spring Break Week and Summer, 6 weeks

USF partners with Education Central Europe in offering both Spring Break and summer session programs. Programs focus on the on-going cultural and political transformation taking place in Central Europe today. The ECE Lecture series featuring prominent speakers at the forefront of politics, culture and civil society, is an integral part of the program. Students in the Prague Spring Seminar spend seven days learning in-depth about the legislative and political process in the Czech Republic. The Summer Program allows students a more in-depth experience. Students may choose from several different academic tracks: Transition in Central Europe, The Jewish Experience in Central Europe, and Central European Culture Studies. **USF credit included.**



Dominican Republic

USF Health International

Summer, 1 week

This one week intensive global health program highlights health challenges in a unique Caribbean island country. The Dominican Republic and its capital Santo Domingo are rapidly changing, making this an excellent location in which to study multidimensional elements of globalization and health. The program includes meetings with health-related organizations, hands-on health prevention in inner-city life in the capital city and a field trip to rural areas of the Dominican Republic. Students of Public Health as well as those in Environmental Sciences and Anthropology will benefit most from this program. **3 USF credits.**

England & France

1 week, May Intersession

A study tour that visits London and Paris is conducted by a USF professor of Government and International Affairs. The study tour focuses on urban cultures and comparative urban politics. It features organized touring enhanced by specially arranged lectures, guided walking tours of neighborhoods and visits to political institutions and historic sites. Hotel housing, all group activities and ground transportation and USF fees are included. Pre-departure classes are held at USF. **3 USF credits.**

France

USF French Culture Summer Program in Paris

4 weeks, June

A course on French culture and civilization offers students from all disciplines the opportunity to experience Paris. Visits to historic buildings, monuments, museums, and sites of contemporary interest are included as part of the course. Students who wish to study French may register for an optional language class. Students are housed in a French foyer. Several excursions outside of Paris are included in the program.

3 USF credits; additional credit available.

Art and Art History Program in Paris

4 weeks, June

Students of art or related disciplines may immerse themselves in Paris through visual arts investigations under the guidance of USF art faculty. Paris is the classroom for courses that explore its museums, galleries, architecture, streets and people. Housing is in French foyers. In general, up to six credits may be earned. An optional three-day excursion is offered to another key city in Europe (London and Venice have been destinations in the past). **3 or more USF credits.**

USF Dance in Paris Program

4 weeks, June

A course in Paris led by USF faculty members will allow students of dance to expand upon information already acquired through courses required of dance majors: history, choreography and technique. The program will feature studio classes taught by Parisian and other European dancers and choreographers. Students will visit the sites of some of history's greatest dance events and attend performances by important dance artists, as part of the program. Housing will be in student residence hotels, or foyers. Day excursions are included, and weekend excursions are optional. **3 or more USF credits.**

USF College of Business Administration Summer International Business Program in Normandy

3 weeks, July/August

The Normandy Business School, located in northern France, is the host institution for a summer group program accompanied by a USF Professor. The program focuses on international business and the EU. Students of business may participate in a program of classes, organized business visits and field trips. Hotel housing is provided. Two courses, one taught by the USF Professor and another by a Professor from the Normandy Business School, offer **6 credits.**

Germany

Osnabrueck Summer MIS Program

3 weeks, July/August

Of particular benefit to students of information systems/decision sciences, this program is hosted by USF's partner institution, the University of Osnabrueck. The experience offers an intensive study of information systems, augmented by a supporting program of visits and cultural excursions. Students will gain an understanding of practical implementation in leading German companies. Housing is in hotels. A visit to Berlin, included, is a program highlight. **6 USF credits.**

German Language and Culture Program

4 weeks, July/August

A program of intensive beginning or intermediate German will take place in the historic city of Osnabrueck. Courses will be taught by a USF professor and instructors from the University of Osnabrueck. Housing will be in a hotel. Classroom instruction is complemented by cultural excursions to famous cities such as Berlin and Hamburg. Students will be able to fulfill the USF language requirement by combining a preparatory 2 week on-line course with on-site instruction. **6-10 USF credits.**

Ulm

Summer study, 8 weeks

This program is designed for undergraduate students who want to have a deeper understanding of the European Union, study in their major, and have the opportunity to learn German. Students take classes in English from the fields of Electrical Engineering, Physics, or EU politics. Intensive German language study is also available. Ulm is a small university city, not far from Switzerland, with good museums, monuments, theatre, and beer gardens. An additional program of excursions and leisure activities is included. Special scholarships are available to assist students in participating in this program.

Ghana

May/June, 3 weeks

This summer 2007 faculty-led program is offered alternate years and is directed by a USF professor from Ghana. It is a unique environmental and cultural study tour visiting sites of historic importance and featuring traditional Ghanaian institutions and ceremonies. The program is open to all undergraduate and graduate students with an interest in this area. It is especially recommended for students in anthropology, art, history, and Africana Studies. **6 USF credits.**

Greece

USF Summer Study with the American College of Thessaloniki in Greece

4 weeks, June/July

Students may study through USF at the American College of Thessaloniki in a month long program. Courses are offered in Humanities and Social Sciences, Technology and Science and Business Studies. The program provides housing, on-site orientation and field trips in addition to classes in a broad range of topics and disciplines. Ample opportunities abound for discovery of some of Greece's most beautiful beaches and nearby archeological and historical sites.

3 or 6 credits.

Guatemala

Maya Civilization: Past and Present

Summer, 4 weeks

A faculty-led course focuses on the history of the Maya Civilization in Mesoamerica and offers a comprehensive look at the history of the Maya people and their accomplishments over the past two thousand years. In particular, the course will focus upon the colonial legacies that have shaped Maya communities today. The program will take place primarily in the Kaqchikel region between Guatemala City and Lake Atitlan, due to the rich histories and activism of

indigenous leaders here since the 16th century. Housing, meals, ground transportation and field trips are included. **6 USF credits, undergraduate or graduate.**

India

Summer, 3 weeks

This faculty-led study tour is designed to introduce participants to India's cultural richness with its diverse geographies, lifestyles and religious traditions. Each study tour is unique, combining varying emphases ranging from art and culture, religious traditions, contemporary social issues, urban and rural, north and/or south. Visits to renowned historical monuments and lectures by invited scholars, teachers and interaction with local citizens provide additional context to the USF course. **3 USF credits, undergraduate or graduate.**

Ireland

Media Studies and Professional Writing in Ireland

June/July 3 weeks

The Ireland Study Tour focuses on Irish media systems with special attention paid to Irish literature and history. The tour begins in the West of Ireland with a one-week residency at either the University of Limerick or the National University of Ireland-Galway. Students attend classroom sessions featuring Irish novelists, poets and writers, and also attend lectures on the Irish news and entertainment media systems. The second week, the program travels to the mountains of Connemara, the Aran Islands, Cliffs of Moher, Coole Park, and other sites. The third week, students stay in Killarney and take day trips to the Ring of Kerry, Dingle Peninsula and more. The tour concludes with the last four days in Dublin and features day trips out, including the world-famous Neolithic site at Newgrange. **3-6 USF credits.**

Italy

USF Study Center in Florence

2 sessions, 6 weeks: May/June or July/August

The program site is the city known as the birthplace of the Renaissance. Amid centuries-old palaces and fortresses, the program offers Italian language study, plus courses given in English on Italian culture & civilization, current politics of Italy, Italian history, and Art History. Students are housed in shared private apartments and have a structured class schedule balanced by organized field trips and site visits. Weekends are free for personal travel or optional group excursions. Undergraduate and graduate students from any discipline are welcome to apply. Most students enroll for **7 to 10 USF credits.**

In Development:

USF Anthropology Program in Florence, Bologna and Ferrara

Europe, Multi-Country

USF College of Business Administration Program

June/July, 4 weeks

Know Europe is a unique academic touring program organized by four European partner institutions of the Normandy Business School. Participants have the unique opportunity to appreciate the complexity of the European business scene, both from a Northern & Southern Europe perspective. The four-week program travels from Brussels to Amsterdam, Paris, Le Havre & Caen, and ends in Barcelona. Visits are scheduled to the European Parliament, US Mission, American Chamber of Commerce, US & Australian Embassies, and local businesses in most locations. This program will benefit graduate students and advanced undergraduates in International Business, Economics, and Marketing. **6 credits.**

US Jazz Program & Music Tour

Summer, Approx. 2 weeks

Students in USF's renowned Jazz Ensemble will perform at some of the most prestigious European Jazz Festivals including the North Sea Jazz Festival in The Hague (Holland) and the Vienne Jazz festival outside of Lyon (France). The complete itinerary will be posted later this year. Students or community residents with an interest in learning more about Jazz will accompany the performing group and hear lectures on Jazz and its history to supplement their attendance at the festival concerts.

Panama

College of Nursing Program

Summer, 3 weeks

College of Nursing students, accompanied by the USF Program Director, will participate in a three week trip to Panama to do their community course Clinical Experience. The program is planned in conjunction with the University of Panama and the USF HEALTH Office in Panama City. USF nursing students will be able to participate with University of Panama students in a number of public clinic visits and have direct engagement with patients. Lodging will be at the City of Knowledge in Panama City.

Intensive Spanish Language Study

Any month, 3 weeks or longer

USF partners with ILISA, a Spanish language institute in Panama City, Panama, to offer Spanish at any level. The ILISA

language institute facilities are located within the City of Knowledge, within sight of the Panama Canal. Programs of 3 weeks or longer allow students to earn USF credit for language classes taught by ILISA instructors. Programs are tailored to students' language needs, and include homestay accommodations (with 2 meals/day). ILISA organizes cultural excursions and visits to sites such as indigenous Indian communities, craft markets, national parks and rain forests.

Russia

May/June, 3 weeks

An intensive program of Russian studies, centered in Moscow and St. Petersburg, features visits to places of cultural, political and historical significance. This program will be of particular benefit to students in international studies, history and Russian language studies. Although recommended, Russian language proficiency is not a requirement. The program will be led by two USF faculty with years of expertise and experience in Russia, Russian language, history and contemporary society. Housing, all group touring and travel are provided as part of the program. **6 USF credits.**

Spain

Madrid or Salamanca

July, 4 weeks or June/July, 6 weeks

USF /FORSPRO Study Center: Students may choose to study in the capital city of Madrid or in the ancient university of town of Salamanca. Classes in Spanish are offered at all levels, and courses in Spanish history, culture, and civilization are offered in English or Spanish, depending on the needs of the students in the program. Organized field trips and cultural excursions are available. This program is designed to appeal to undergraduate and graduate students from a range of disciplines. Housing is arranged by the program. **3-6 USF credits.**

UK

USF College of Business Administration Summer Program in Wales

July/August, 3 weeks

Students of business may study international business and inter-cultural business management in Wales, UK. The host institution and central program site is the University of Glamorgan, in Pontypridd, Wales. Classes taught by a USF instructor and an instructor from the University of Glamorgan Business School are augmented by organized visits to Welsh businesses and industries. Excursions to important cultural and historic sites that provide a broader context are also included. University housing is provided. Pre-departure classes at USF precede the program. **6 USF credits**



Cambridge

British Schools Experience

June/July, 3 weeks

Education majors, graduate students and teachers will benefit from a program in Cambridge, England that focuses on field experience in British primary schools. Courses are offered in collaboration with the Cambridgeshire County School System. The USF Program Director coordinates students' experiences as part of the USF course and administers the program on-site. Students stay in a traditional Bed and Breakfast establishment. Transportation to local schools is provided by the program. Students earn 3-6 USF credits, depending upon academic level and degree program.

Cambridge

University of Cambridge International Summer Schools

July/August, 2 to 6 weeks

The University of Cambridge, one of the world's great universities, presents its annual International Summer School program. Students may choose from among a variety of academic sessions: International Term I and II (with over 100 courses), Literature, Art History, Science and History Summer School sessions. Students from almost any discipline (literature, history, political science, art, sciences, and more) will find courses in their majors. Lodging is provided in one of the traditional halls of residence where students take their meals. Evening lectures and concerts take place in all the summer school sessions and an excursions program is offered. Weekends are free. **Inquire about USF credit available.**

Canada

Quebec

Laval University

Laval University is located in the heart of Quebec City, the capital of Quebec. Popular courses include intensive French Language and Business, but students may select any courses in the curriculum for which they have the prerequisites, including the equivalent of two years of college-level French for study in academic departments (not required for the intensive French program). Laval is a French-language university.

Montreal

Concordia University

Concordia is a large urban university located in Montreal. Popular courses of study include: Arts & Sciences, Engineering, and Business. Concordia is an English-language university, so courses are given in English.

Costa Rica

San José

University of Costa Rica

UCR is located in the capital city, San José. USF students of business study primarily Latin American Business and Spanish, but those proficient in Spanish may select from a wider range of courses.

Independent Language Study

4 weeks to 1 semester

Students earn USF credit for Spanish language study at either of two USF-approved language institutes in San Jose. Housing is arranged by the schools, and is generally in host families, who also provide two meals per day. The institutes arrange field trips and other activities which students are welcome to participate in.

Denmark

Aarhus

Aarhus School of Business

This program is offered primarily to Business students, and a second track in Communications is available. The school is located along the east coast on the mainland of Denmark. Students can select from a number of courses taught in English.

England

France

Various Cities –

Independent Language Study

4 weeks to 1 semester

Students may earn USF credit for their study of French language at USF-approved language institutes in France. The institutes help arrange housing for students and offer optional field trips and other related activities. USF students have studied at the Institut de Touraine in Tours, and at the Alliance Francaise in various cities within France.

Paris

Semester/Year Program at Universities of Paris, through MICEFA

Students may study at one of the Universities of Paris through the MICEFA consortium based in Paris. USF is a participating member institution of the MICEFA consortium. While students studying at these universities must have adequate proficiency in French to undertake college-level work in French, students enrolling in MICEFA are offered at least one seminar class taught in English by a visiting American professor. Intensive, accelerated language and orientation programs precede semester study.

Germany

Osnabrueck

The University of Osnabrueck, located in northwest Germany near the Netherlands, offers a wide variety of courses. The university is situated in a quaint city, famous for its historical roots, with accessibility to many destinations of interest in Europe. Students participating in this program must have adequate proficiency in German (generally four semesters of college level instruction), since they take university courses taught in German alongside German students. A special scholarship of \$1,000 per semester is available to students in this program.

Ulm

The University of ULM is located in Southern Germany. Undergraduate and graduate level students may attend. With few exceptions, all courses are taught in German. Students should have completed four semesters of college level German to study at Ulm. Intensive German is offered as an extracurricular course.

Greece

Thessaloniki

Semester Program at American College in Thessaloniki

Students choose courses from a large undergraduate curriculum delivered in English at the American College in Thessaloniki, Greece's second largest city. Students will enjoy Thessaloniki's vibrant student life (over 60,000 Greek students study at universities there) and will live in apartments in the central city area, along with Greek students. Thessaloniki's pristine beaches, pleasant weather and easy access to the rest of Europe are additional attractions, as is the individual attention given to each student by the multinational faculty. Several full scholarships are available for Greek-Americans.

Italy

Siena

Semester or Academic Year

Students are enrolled at The University of Siena, in Italy's Tuscany region. Administered by the History Department, this program is aimed at graduate students or advanced undergraduates with intermediate or advanced proficiency in Italian and a specialization in Italian Studies.

Florence

Semester or Academic Year

Students are enrolled through USF at the SUS Consortium Study Center in Florence. A number of courses, including history, art history, political science, studio art, and Contemporary Italy are offered in English. Italian language study is offered at several levels, depending on the needs of the students who enroll each semester. Students live in apartments. A number of cultural excursions are included and additional optional trips can be arranged.

Japan

Hirakata

Kansai Gaidai University

Located between Osaka and Kyoto, in southern Japan, the Hirakata area is considered the cultural heart of Japan. A wide selection of courses, many relating to Asia, is taught in English. Japanese language study is an integral part of the program. One year of college-level Japanese is a pre-requisite for this program. Students who are fluent in Japanese may take courses offered in Japanese in a number of academic departments where the university's Japanese students study.

Mexico

Puebla

Universidad de las Americas

UDLA is located in Puebla, two hours south of Mexico City in an area rich in history and archaeology. A large curriculum is available for students with fluency in Spanish, in the schools of Science, Social Science, Engineering, Business, and Humanities. Some courses are offered in English as well. An intensive Spanish language program allows students to make good progress in a few months of study.

Mayab

University of Mayab

Located in the Yucatan, this university offers an opportunity for USF students to study in an area particularly rich in archaeology and history. Students fluent in Spanish may select from courses across the curriculum. Business students will find a number of courses offered in English. An intensive Spanish language program allows students to make good progress in a few months of study.

South Korea

Seoul

Yonsei University

Yonsei University, the oldest university in Korea, is located on the outskirts of the capital city of Seoul. A number of courses are taught in English, including Social Sciences, Business and Humanities. The study of Korean language is an integral part of this program. Students fluent in Korean can select courses taught in the native language.

Gyeongsan

Yeungnam University

Beginning fall semester 2007, USF students will have the opportunity to study on exchange at Yeungnam University in South Korea. Yeungnam is located in Gyeongsan, a peaceful city located in the southeastern part of Korea, and adjacent to Daegu metropolis, Korea's 3rd largest city. Exchange students may choose from over 30 general education courses, in English or Chinese.

Independent Language Study

4 weeks to 1 semester

Students earn USF credit for study at USF-approved language institutes in Spain. The following locations are available: Madrid, Barcelona, Salamanca, Valencia, and Seville. Housing is arranged by the schools, in family homestays or student residences. Field trips and other cultural activities are offered by the schools.

Salamanca

Semester Study Abroad in English and Spanish

Students who wish to take the bulk of their coursework in English and wish also to study Spanish may take classes as part of a program in Salamanca, sponsored by FORSPRO. This educational program provider arranges housing and offers an on-site program administrator. A program of optional cultural events and excursions is available.

Granada

A USF-approved program of study, offering a wide range of courses taught in English and Spanish, is sponsored by AIFS in Granada. The comprehensive academic program includes homestay or student residence housing, cultural activities, weekend excursions and year-round on-site program coordination.

A one-week touring program for Honors College students will allow them to experience either the natural wonders, diverse environments and unique ecology of Costa Rica or historic Panama, site of the famous Panama Canal, where they will wonder at Panama's biodiversity, varied landscapes and fascinating indigenous communities. Site visits planned will allow students to appreciate the delicate balance between the environment and development.

USF-approved programs available through Educational Consortia

Students may enroll in any number of educational programs abroad sponsored by various educational consortia in which USF is a member institution or has affiliation agreements with. Well-known educational organizations include AIFS, CCIS, CIEE, and KEI. These organizations offer programs in regions where USF may not have its own programs, thus extending a wider range of choices of study abroad locations to students. Countries include South Africa, Russia, Hungary, and Thailand, to name a few.

Some of the organizations listed above offer internship opportunities in conjunction with their programs abroad or as separate learning experiences. AIFS offers internship programs in London during the summer or academic year, and KEI has 2 month internship programs during the summer.
